



To Parent/Carers,

<b>Draw a fairy/knight</b> – Can you child draw their own fairy or knight? Where might they live? What do they look like? What special powers does your fairy have? <b>Hopscotch</b> – all you need is some tape! Create the traditional hopscotch squares on the floor and add the numbers. Can you hop? Can you jump on the correct number? You could always use the tape to create a road too! <b>Guess my shape:</b> cut out some 2D shapes using paper/envelopes/card/boxes. See if your child knows the name of each shape first. Talk about sides and corners. Hide the shapes, then pick one and describe your shape. E.g. my shape has 4 corners and 4 sides.
