Ice and Water – first of all collect some natural things from the garden. We used daisies, sticks and leaves. Using an ice tray or a cup/container put the flowers in this and fill with water. Then put in the freezer. The following day, see if you child can get to the flowers. What happened to the water? How does it feel? Talk about the changes.
