Create an alien! – You can either draw an alien, use play dough or use junk modelling to create one! What is special about your alien? Does it have any powers? How many eyes does it have? Imagination – once you have created your rocket and alien, encourage your child to talk about where the rocket might go. Would it go to the moon? Another planet? A great story to read/watch is Whatever Next all about a bear who created his own rocket and went to space! Aliens love underpants – you can listen to this story using YouTube. During this story ask your child lots of questions including why and how questions. For example how did the aliens get to Earth? Can your child create a picture of their own pants? What patterns might you have? Phonics – Write down the letters S, A,T, P. Encourage your child to look at this and trace over them. Talk about each one and what their sound is. What begins with a Sssss? Do this with all the letters.
