# Reception

We have made it to the end of our first term and time has really flown by. The children have settled extremely well into school life and have learnt lots of new skills, grown in confidence and independence, adjusted to new routines and made many new friendships over the term. I am sure we are all ready for a break from routine, however please keep reading, writing and counting with the children over the holiday period keeping all those skills fresh for the new year. This week we have been looking at the Christmas Story in more detail and the children have been retelling the story and painting scenes. We have also been dressing up and role playing the characters from the story. We have found out how people prepare and celebrate Christmas and have shared our own Christmas routines with our peers. We have been using scissors this week to carefully follow a model to cut out and create Christmas pictures. In our Kinetic letters we have been learning how to form the final family of letters 'The Slider Family' these are the trickiest letters to form. In phonic session Mrs Morris' group have been blending and segmenting single words using all of the phase 2 sounds, while Mr Lees' group have been reading and writing sentences using the phase 2 sounds. In our Maths sessions Mrs Morris' group have been counting out the correct number of items from a larger group while Mr Lees' group have been finding one more/less from a given number.
