Reporting Covid-19 over Christmas

A letter was emailed to all parents/carers this week, regarding letting school know about positive test results in the first week of the holidays. If you have not received this letter, please let the school office know.

The guidance states:

Parents to tell school about a positive test result for your child where their symptoms started on or before Sunday 20th December; or

Parents tell school about a positive test result for your child where the test date was on or before Sunday 20th December and your child didn't have any symptoms.

When telling the school about positive test results please provide the following information:

- The date symptoms started (or if there were no symptoms);
- The date the test was taken (not the date you received the result);
- The date your child's self-isolation ends.
