At breaktime, your parents/carer can order you a bagel for 50p. If you would like one, please remind the adult who looks after you to order one for you online.




You can bring in a filled water bottle from home. We do have refill stations which you can use to top them up. Water Bottles can be purchased from the office for £1.50.
