3/4N: Wednesday

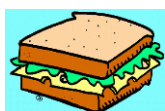


Make sure you have a **NAMED** PE kit in school. You will be expected to change so please do not wear your kit to school. Please ensure earrings are removed, and long hair tied up.

Daily Reading. Every day we will have half an hour's silent reading session in class. Your teacher will try to listen to you read at least once every other week. We ask that you take your book home to read and ask someone at home to listen to you read at least once a week, then sign your record book. You will earn a housepoint every time you read at home. Every child should have two books.



Homework will be assigned on a Friday each week. To be completed by the following Wednesday.

You will be given a book for English and Maths Homework the same as last year. Your teacher will tell you which page to complete each week.



Make sure you complete your homework as it helps to embed that week's learning. Just ask your teacher if you need help!

Spelling: You will be tested for spellings every two weeks. You will have time to learn these spellings in school, but it is advised to learn them at home.

End of the Day: Children will be released from the 3/4 doors of their respective classes. Please leave space in front of the doors so that staff are able to see adults before they release the children. If you wish to speak to the class teacher please wait until all children have been dismissed first.


